## THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St Ignatius of Loyola** – the founder of the Society of Jesus. The Jesuits helped to heal much of the harm done in Britain and on the Continent by the Reformation and, in addition, took the Faith to new mission-fields – in India, the Far East and South America. Today, we give thanks for God's gift to the Church: our first Jesuit Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Alphonsus Liguori** – almost 300 years ago, St Alphonsus founded the Redemptorist Fathers near Naples. He became famous both as a preacher and as a writer, especially on moral theology. He composed a number of hymns, including 'O Bread of heaven' and 'O Mother blest'.

Saturday is the **Memorial of St John Vianney (Curé of Ars)** - the Patron Saint of Parish Priests. Like his Divine Master, St John hated sin, but loved the sinner.
